#### PIMMS CAPITAL

- Capitalising on Partner Initiatives in Mobility
  Management Services
- Capitalisation projects focus specifically on the transfer of regional development good practices into mainstream EU Structural Funds Programmes
- Each of the 12 regions in PIMMS CAPITAL prepare a <u>Regional Action Plan</u> that clearly sets out how the selected good practices will be 'imported'









# The PIMMS CAPITAL **R**egional **A**ction **P**lans

The RAP is the main result of a Capitalisation project

- Collect, analyse, transfer, disseminate good
  practice
- •Transfer of previously identified good practices into mainstream Structural Funds programmes
- Target is the Regional Operational Programme:
  policy impact getting something done









# The PIMMS CAPITAL **R**egional **A**ction **P**lans

It's a concrete action plan that specifies how the identified good practices will be implemented under the mainstream programme of the regions

- 1) Rationale
- 2) The Regional Authority
- 3) The Good Practices
- 4) Sustainability and Transferability

#### RAP results

#### This is a **preliminary** outcome of the project:

- No of GP studied: 41
- No of GP that have been implemented or considered of interest: 36 [of which]:
  - No of GP proposed for funding in ROP: 17
  - No of GP proposed for other funding: 19
- ROP/ERDF funding: ranging from €20,000 to €30M
- No of regional/local policies addressed: 18









### RAP results: examples

- CENTRO, learning from Frankfurt and Treviso, has included in the RAP proposals that relate to Super Smart Ticketing and Passenger Information & Telematics;
- Stockholm county, learning from CENTRO and Frankfurt, has imported the "Corridor Approach" idea;
- Treviso, learning from CENTRO, Limerick and Frankfurt, will institutionalize the concept of sustainable mobility in the ROP;









### RAP: problems & obstacles

What are the main difficulties encountered during the process?

- Funding RAP too late in the program period 2007-2013 [ 6/12 MA's];
- Administrative structure/ Framework authorities [3/12 MA's]
- Lack of awareness/support among stakeholders
  [2/12 MA's]
- GP's difficult to replicate/implement [1/12 MA's]









# Concluding Remarks #1

- The exchange of Good Practices is possible;
- It helps to initiate very important policy shifts;
- It contributes to put sustainable mobility even higher in the local/regional agenda;
