What sort of training do we expect for our students?	 ➤ Our students From 15 to 20 students, who will be on year 2 out of 3 of their Baccalauréat (french official degree). They will have passed a BEPA, a french official degree in agriculture. Before training abroad, they will have trained in France for around ten weeks of practice on various farms (cows and horses, mainly). 90% of them are female students, 17 years old on average.

> Lenght and period of training

We wish for a three-week period, preferably in March or April

> Training conditions

- Each student will benefit an « Erasmus+ » grant, that will cover his transportation, accommodation and catering expenses.
- This training period is part of the degree. Students are expected to acquire some professional skills, listed below.
- Each student will receive a cultural and linguistic preparation, that will help him to attend his training period in the best conditions.
- During the whole training period, students will be accompanied by a French tutor.

Professional skills to be developed

- Breeding: supervising, giving care to and feeding animals,
- Pastures: supervising grazing animals, assessing the stature of pasture,
- Use and maintenance of farm machinery,
- Commercialization and marketing, learn how all that is produced on the farm will be sold on the market downstream,
- Management: work planification and organization,
